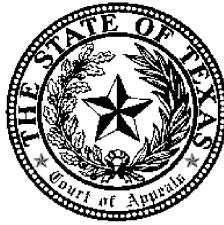

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**MEMORANDUM OPINION**

This is an appeal from a from a temporary injunction signed May 8, 2001. On August 24, 2001, appellees filed a motion in the trial court to dissolve the temporary injunction. On August 28, 2001, the trial court granted appellees' motion and signed an order dissolving the temporary injunction.

On September 19, 2001, appellants filed a motion to dismiss the appeal because the appeal has been rendered moot. *See* TEX. R. APP. P. 42.1(a)(2). The motion is granted.

Appellants also moved to have their appellate costs taxed against appellees. That motion is GRANTED. *See* TEX. R. APP. P. 43.4.

Accordingly, the appeal is ordered dismissed.
