

Counties That Redistricted Their Justice Courts

During fiscal year 2002, redistricting occurred in one or more justice of the peace precincts in each of the three counties listed below. While the boundaries of a precinct may have been altered, the precinct and/or place number may not necessarily have changed.

For those courts assigned a *new* precinct and/or place number, activity data were compiled by judge and recorded under the judge's new precinct and/or place number in order to maintain consistency. For example, a judge may have served three months in the old precinct (Precinct 1-1) and nine months in the new precinct (Precinct 2-1). The judge's total reported activity equals the sum of the statistics for the periods served in the old precinct (Precinct 1-1) and the new precinct (2-1) and is reported under the new precinct (2-1) only.

The changes in precinct and/or place number resulting from redistricting are shown below.
