III. VENUE

Respondent is an attorney licensed to practice law in Texas and is a member of the STATE BAR OF TEXAS. Respondent's principal place of practice is Galveston County, Texas; therefore, venue is appropriate in Galveston County, Texas, pursuant to Rule 3.03 of the TEXAS RULES OF DISCIPLINARY PROCEDURE. 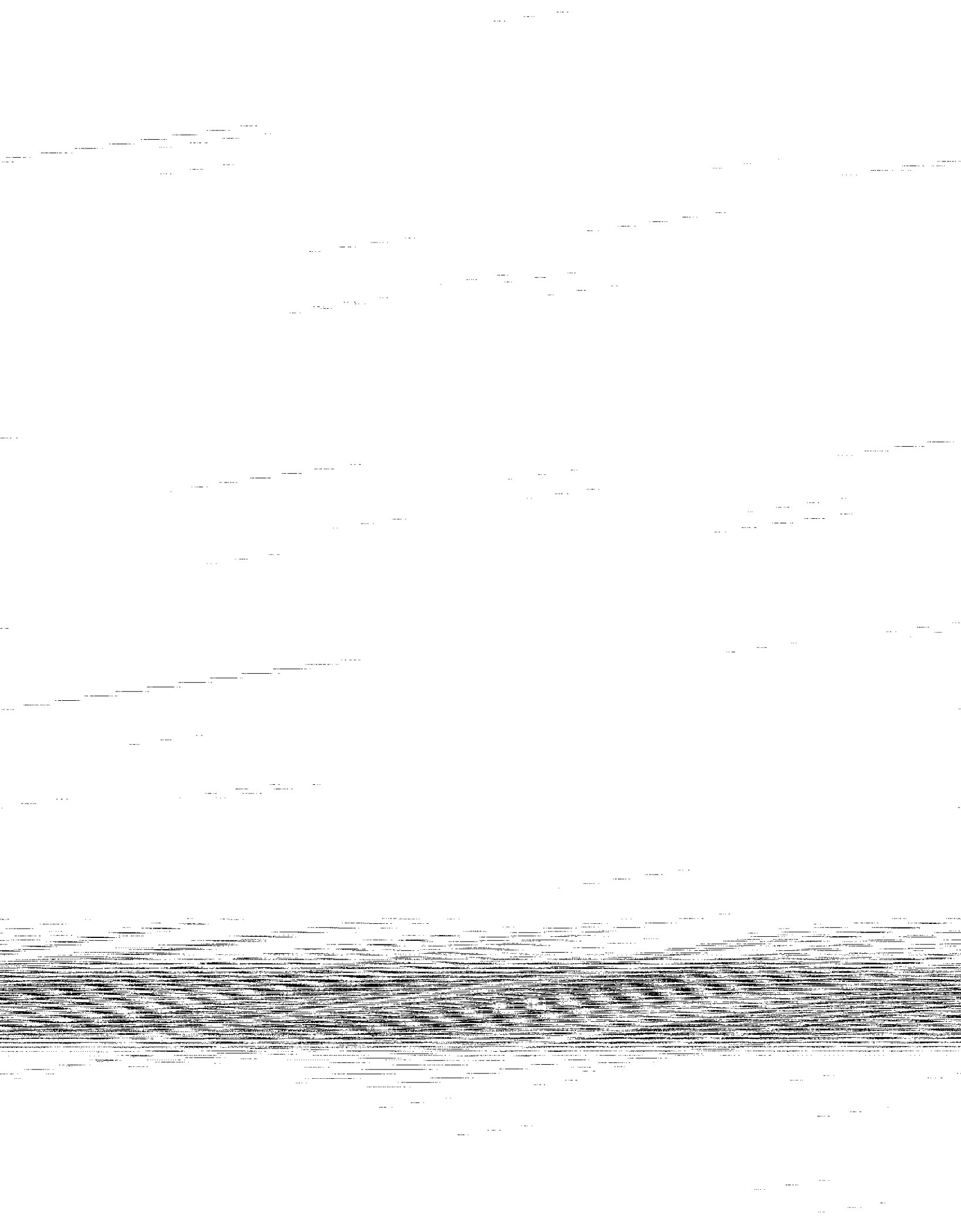
IV. FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION

On or about May 26, 1998, HERMAN E. ADAMS (hereinafter referred to as "ADAMS") hired Respondent for legal representation arising out of personal injuries he sustained during a 1997 liver biopsy at M.D. Anderson Hospital. For almost two (2) years, Respondent attempted unsuccessfully to refer the case to another lawyer; however, Respondent failed to consult with ADAMS about the potential for referral and/or advise ADAMS of the status of his efforts. Further, Respondent failed to promptly comply with ADAMS' reasonable requests for information.

In or around April of 2000, almost two (2) years after he was hired and after the expiration of the applicable statute of limitations, Respondent withdrew from the representation. As a result of Respondent's neglect and failure to file suit, ADAMS was unable to retain other counsel since his medical malpractice claim was time barred.

IV. SECOND CAUSE OF ACTION

On or about February 9, 1999, ADAMS was involved in an automobile accident. Again, ADAMS consulted Respondent for representation. On or about June 23, 1999, Respondent filed suit
