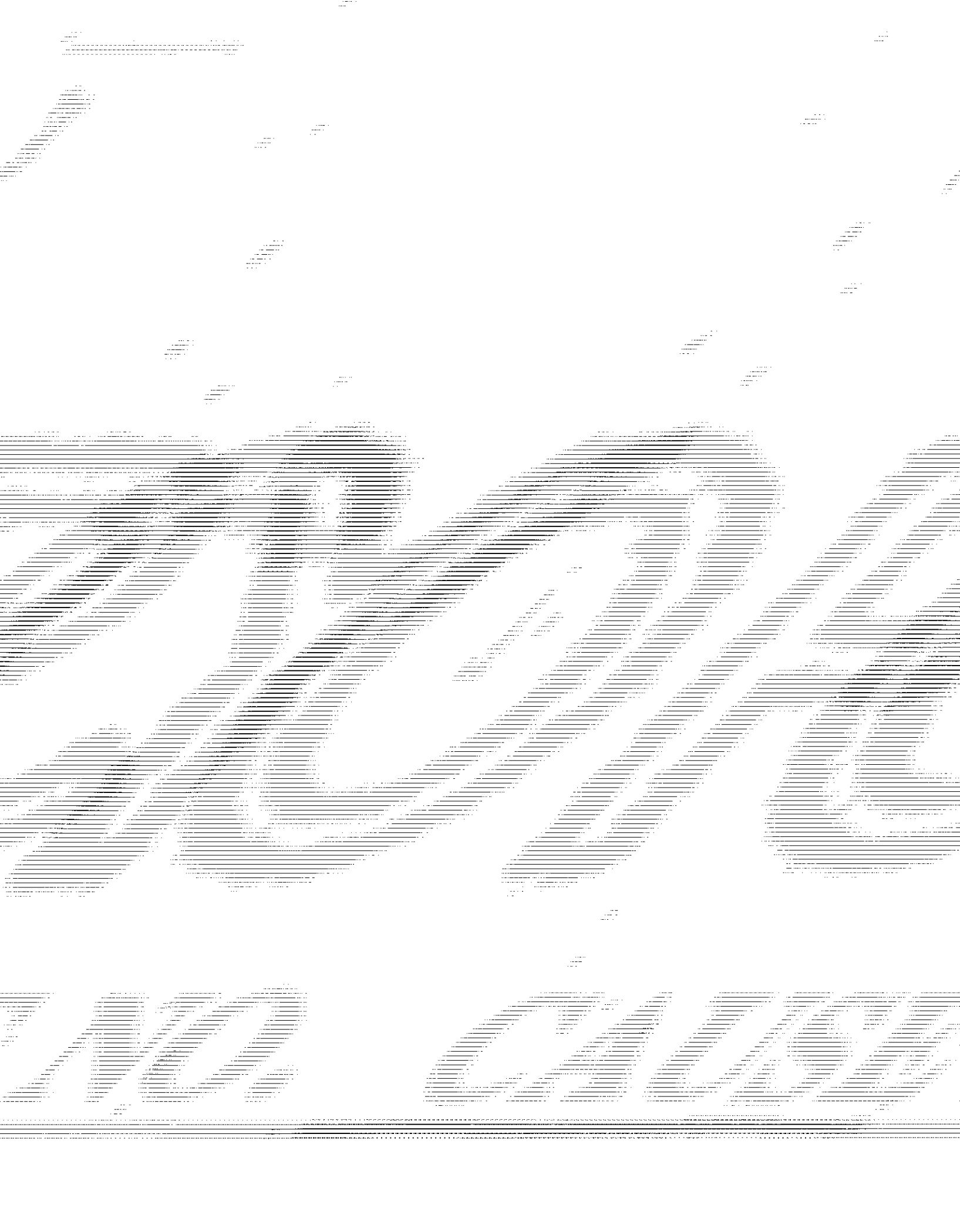

VENUE AND SERVICE

FIRST CAUSE OF ACTION

On or about April 13, 1998, Dorothy F. Woodley, (hereinafter referred to as "Complainant") retained Respondent to represent her son, Damon Woodley (hereinafter referred to as "Woodley"), at a parole board review hearing scheduled for July 10, 1998. At that time, Complainant paid Respondent \$500.00 and later paid Respondent an additional \$200.00 on May 20, 1998. At an April 13, 1998 interview with Complainant, Respondent indicated that he would consult with a former parole board member to seek advise as to how to proceed with Woodley's matter.

V.

From the time of employment to early June 1998, Respondent failed to contact Complainant or Woodley or to otherwise gather information necessary to adequately represent Woodley at the July 10, 1998 parole board review hearing. When Complainant contacted the parole board after the July 10, 1998 hearing to inquire about the board's decision, she was informed that their records had no indication that Respondent was representing Woodley. The parole board further indicated that since they did not show Respondent as the attorney for her

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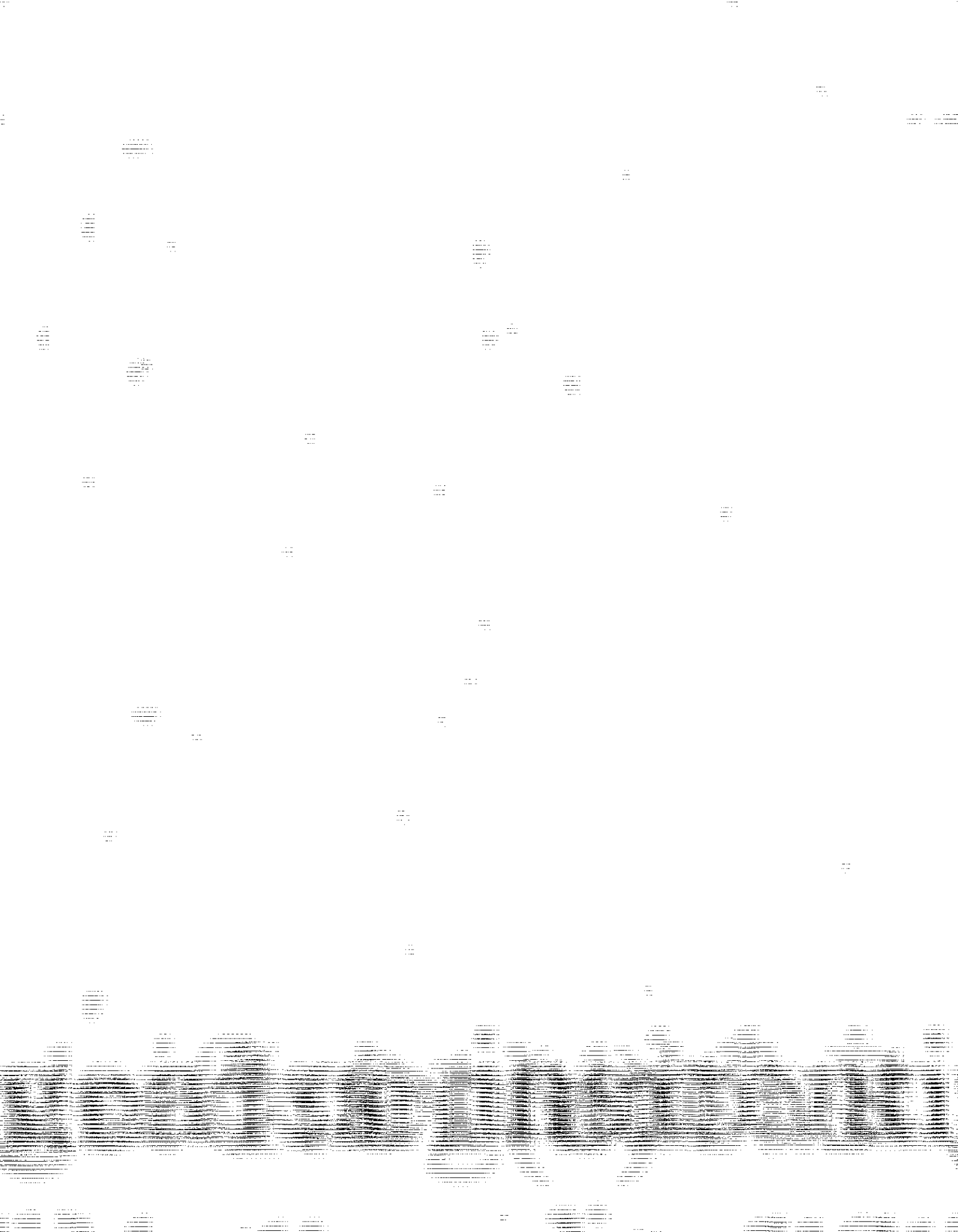
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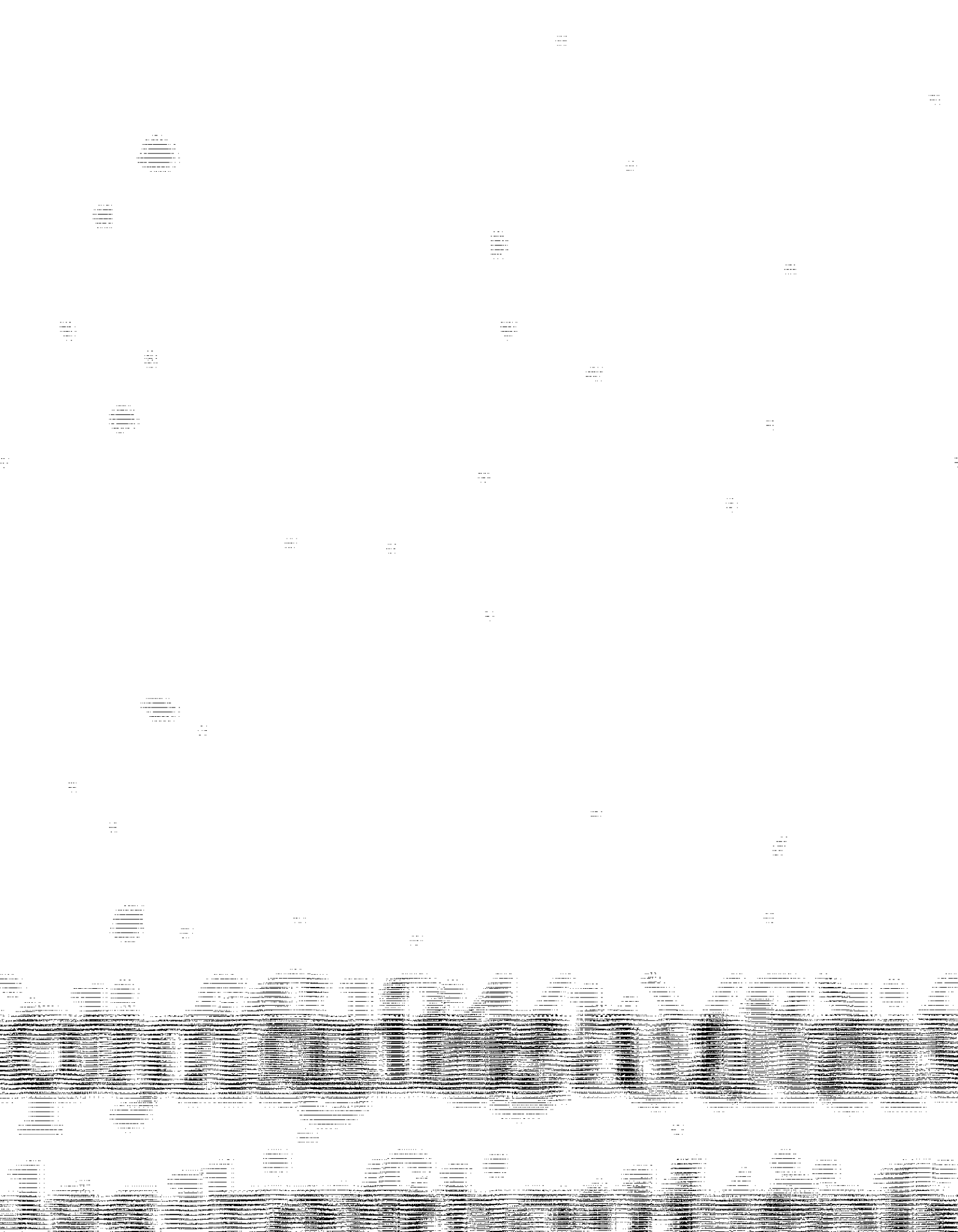
