I.

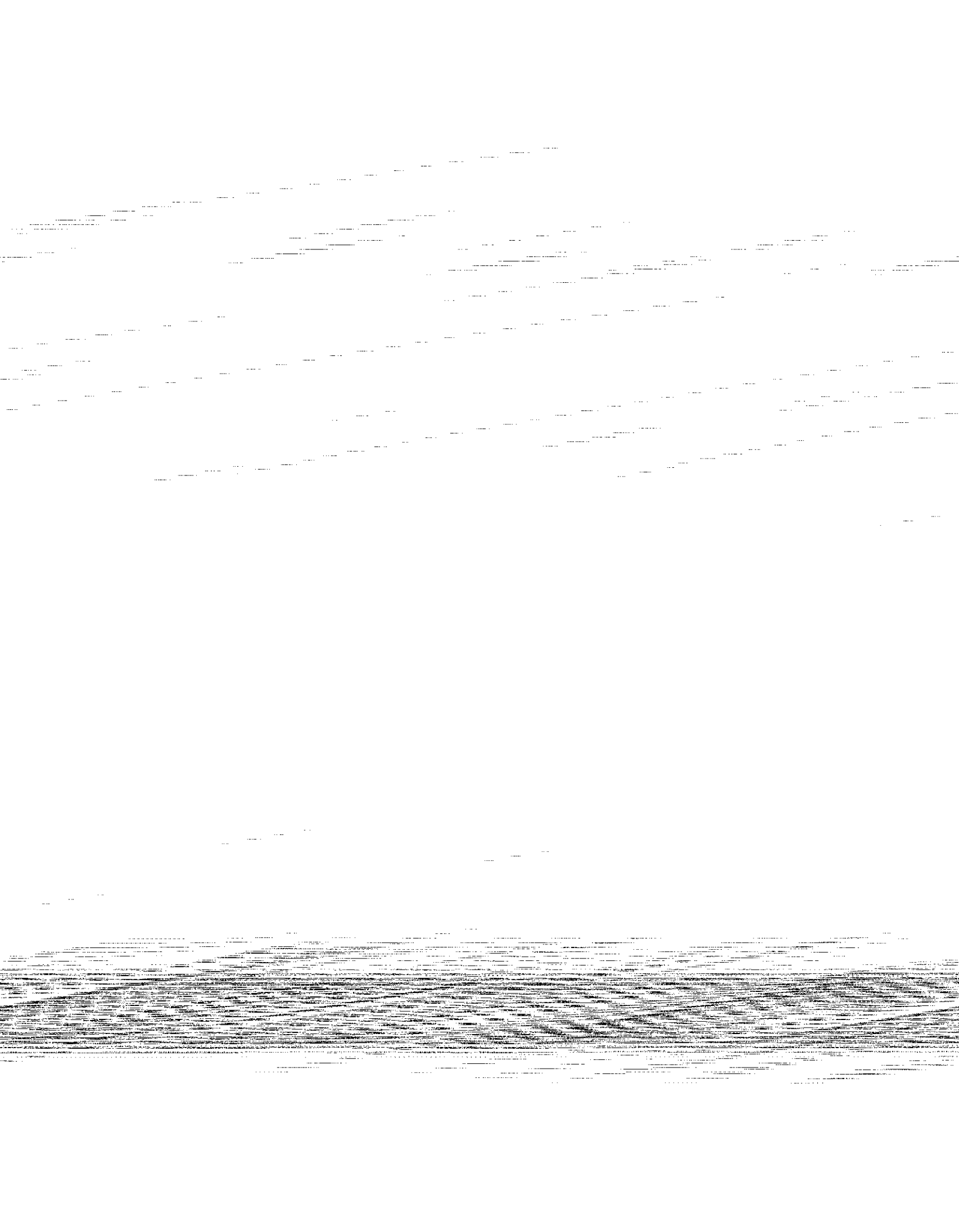

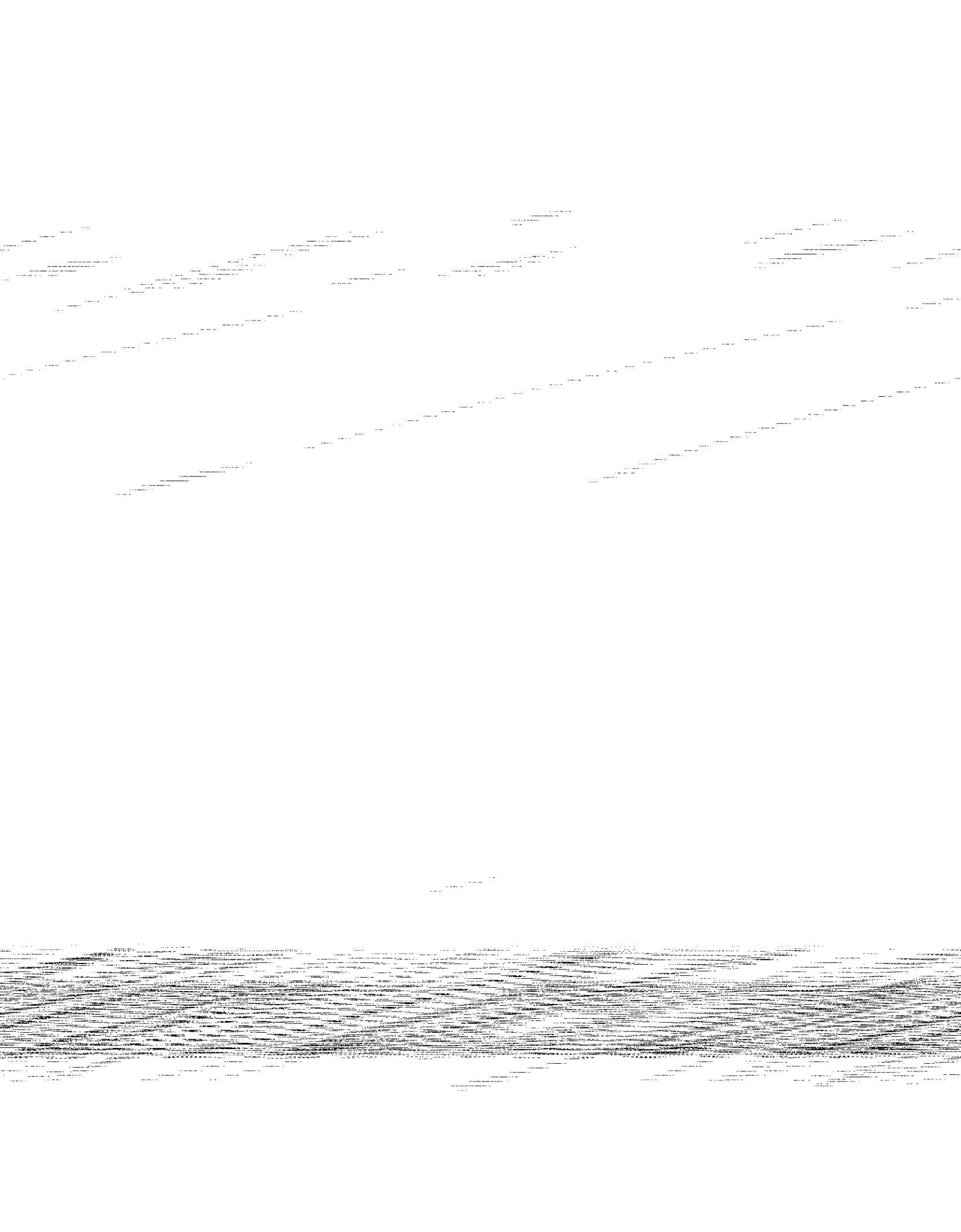
II.
