I.

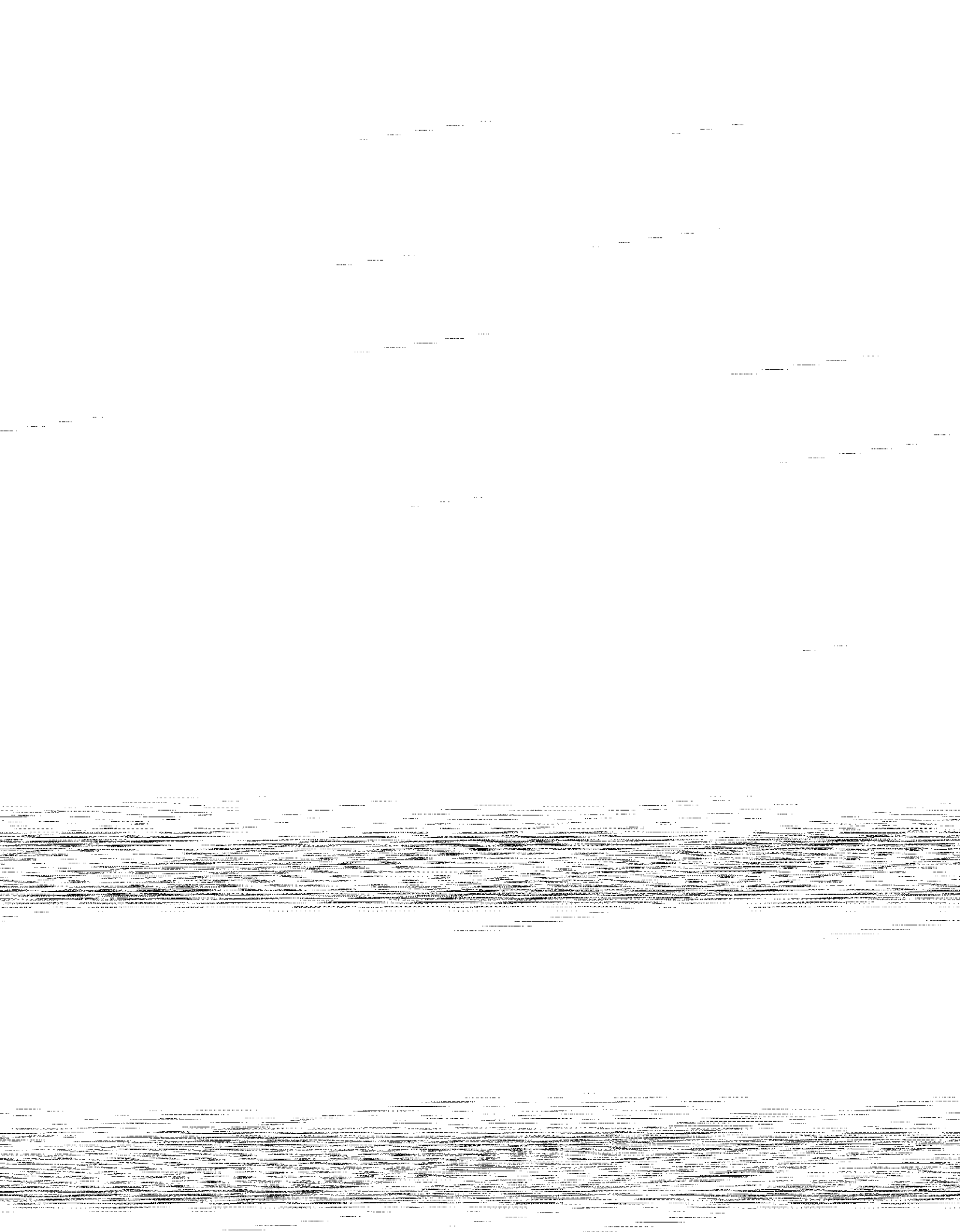

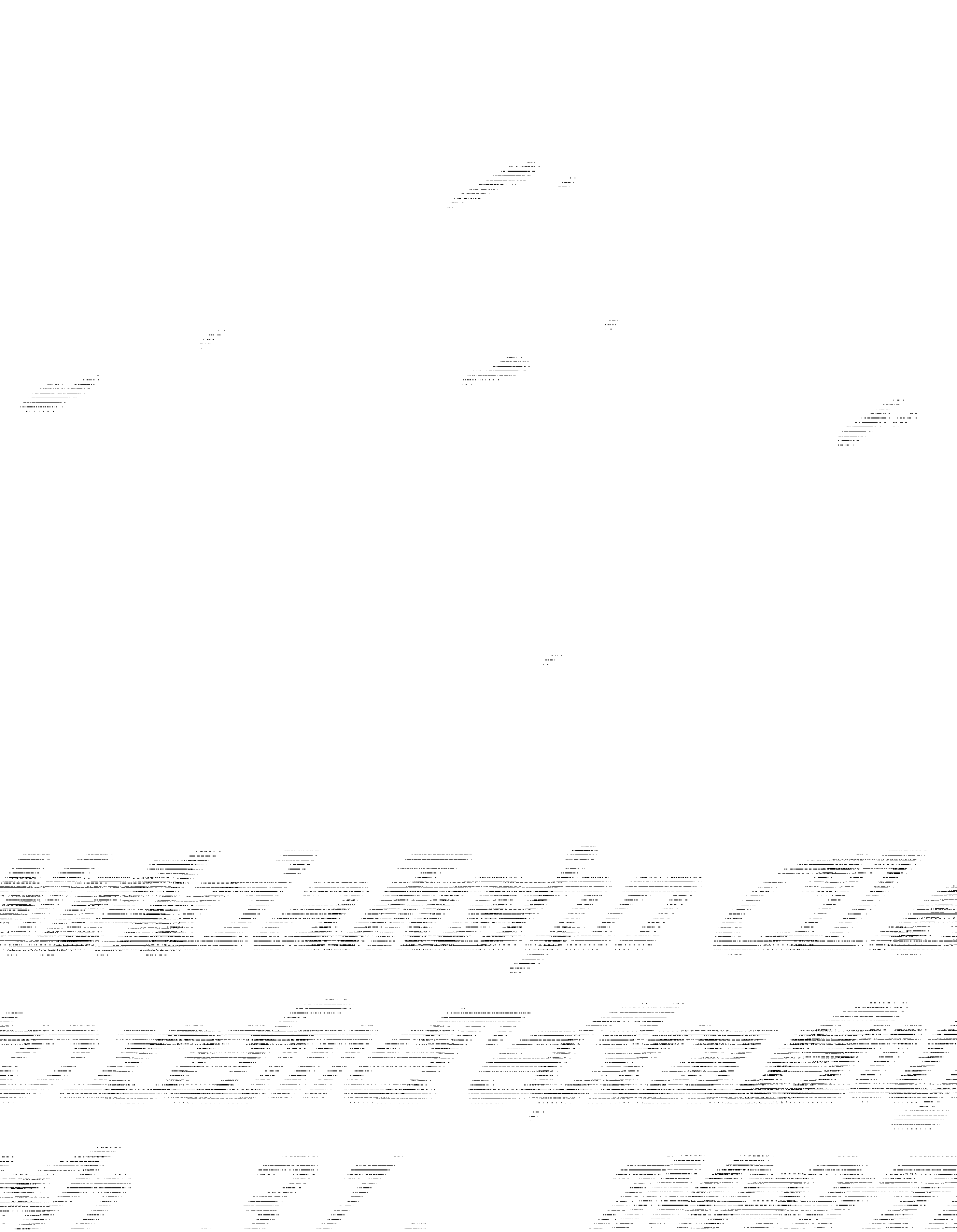
Dear Mr. Adams:
