VOLUNTARY RESIGNATION OF ATTORNEY


ORDER



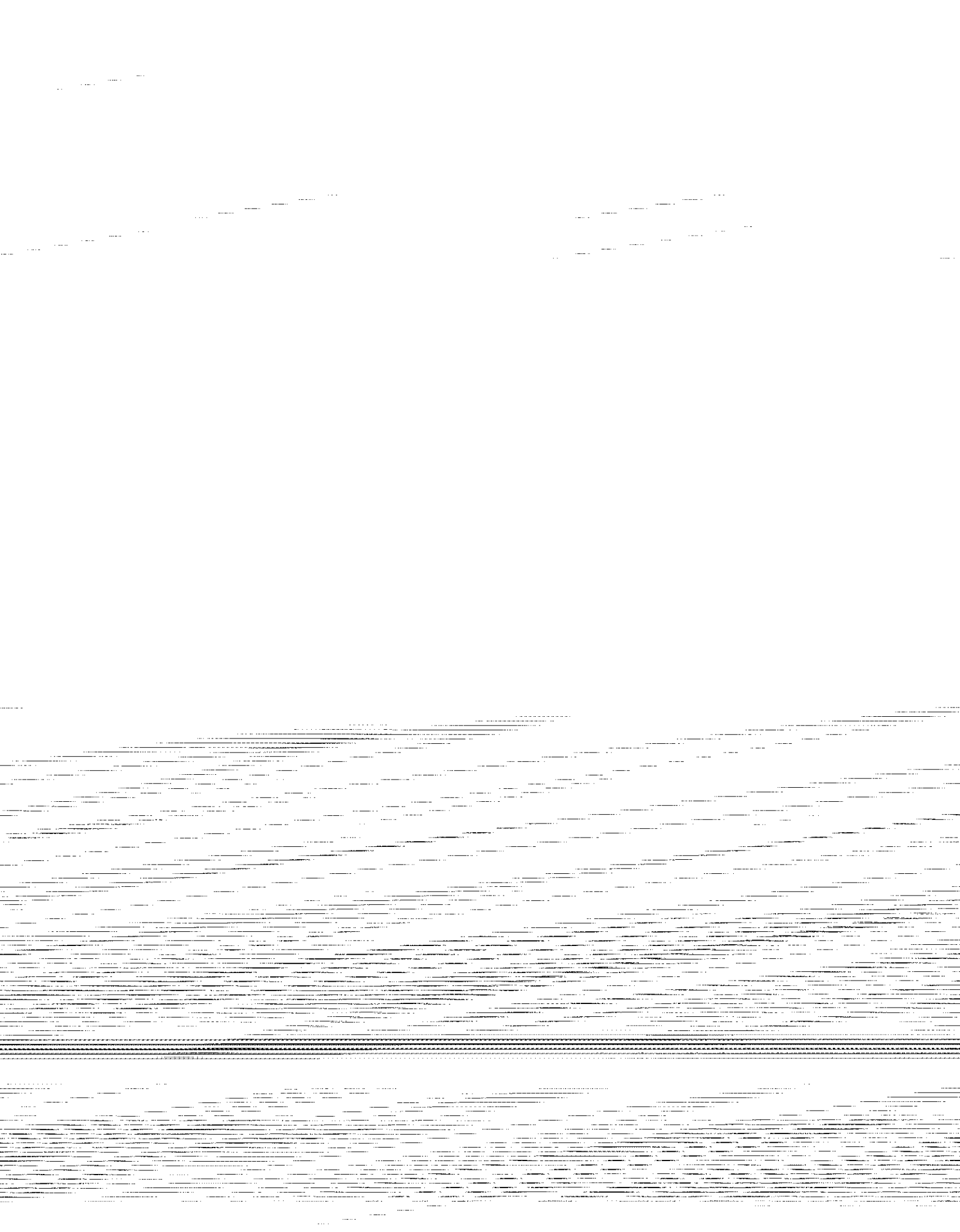
