Notes about Data for Constitutional County Courts for FY 2011

In 2011, 212 of the state's 254 constitutional county courts accepted court cases. The county judge in the other 42 counties either had no judicial functions or assisted in an asneeded basis with cases filed in another court.

At the time of publication, there was a 92.4 percent reporting rate overall for the fiscal year.

No reports were submitted from Brewster, Castro, Edwards, Frio, Martin, and Upton counties.

No reports were submitted from Anderson, Burleson, Dallam, Fayette, Maverick, Medina, Reeves, and Terry counties due to problems with their case management systems.

Due to problems with a new case management system in Clay County, all civil and criminal reports were missing, as well as six months of mental health and probate reports.

Due to problems with a new case management system in Lamar County, no reports were submitted for civil, probate and mental health cases.

Reports for October 2010 through August 2011 were missing for Hudspeth and Waller counties.

Reports for November 2010 through August 2011 were missing for Garza County.
