STANDING ORDER NO. 3

---

In an Order and Opinion, dated February 12, 2018, in *Windsor v. Hatten*, United States District Judge Thomas W. Thrash Jr. “PERMANENTLY ENJOINED” William M. Windsor, and any parties acting in concert with him or at his behest, “from filing any complaint or initiating any proceeding . . . in any court (state or federal) . . . without first obtaining leave of a federal district court in the district in which the new complaint or proceeding is to be filed.”

In violation of Judge Thrash’s February 12, 2018 order, Windsor and those working in concert with him, including William Schreck and Marcie Schreck, have filed numerous different documents in this Court against a number of parties, including several trial court judges and trial court staff. By letters dated May 10, 2022, and May 16, 2022, members of this Court indicated that they will not file a number of notices of appeal filed by Windsor, William Schreck, and Marcie Schreck, as each filing violates Judge Thrash’s February 12, 2018 order.

Pursuant to Judge Thrash's February 12, 2018 order, the Court orders the Clerk of this Court to not file any claims, appeals, or other proceedings received from Windsor, William Schreck, Marcie Schreck, and those working in concert with Windsor, unless any claim, appeal, or other proceeding received from Windsor, William Schreck, Marcie Schreck, or those working in concert with Windsor are accompanied by written documentation evidencing that Windsor, William Schreck, Marcie Schreck, or those working in concert with Windsor obtained leave of a federal district court in the district in which the new complaint or proceeding is to be filed. The Clerk of this Court is further ordered to create a miscellaneous-documents file in which anything we receive from Windsor, William Schreck, Marcie Schreck, or those working in concert with Windsor will be placed after it is received. Upon receipt of materials from Windsor, William Schreck, Marcie Schreck, or those working in concert with Windsor, the Clerk of the Court shall also sign and attach a coversheet acknowledging the receipt of the materials, but also indicating that said materials will not be filed. The Clerk of the Court shall have discretion as to how the miscellaneous-documents file will be maintained, although the file must contain a hard copy of the signed coversheet acknowledging receipt of the tendered document, as well as enough of the tendered document as to identify the document.
