### ADMINISTRATOR'S STATEMENT

The Supreme Court of Texas is the state's highest appellate court for civil matters and the administrative head of the judicial branch. The Court consists of one chief justice and eight justices, two judicial commissions (the Children's Commission and the Judicial Commission on Mental Health), and approximately 81 staff members. The Court has statewide, final appellate jurisdiction in most civil and juvenile cases, a robust and time sensitive mandamus and emergency motions docket, full rulemaking power in civil actions, and rulemaking authority over judicial administration.

The Court has an extensive docket comprised of questions such as statutory and constitutional interpretation, business disputes, election contests, governmental immunity, education, real estate, oil & gas, energy, natural resources, insurance, workers' compensation, family law, and a variety of other civil cases. The Supreme Court also writes rules related to civil procedure and evidence, judicial administration, the practice of law, and the creation of new types of courts such as the business courts. The Court oversees the Texas Access to Justice Commission and the Texas Access to Justice Foundation, supervises the State Bar of Texas and the Board of Law Examiners, and generally provides for the efficient and fair administration of justice for the State of Texas. The Court is aided in all of its duties by outstanding support staff—permanent specialized attorneys who assist with legal research, writing, and court administration; a Clerk of the Court and his deputies, who receive and process electronic filings and interface with the public; law clerks who work for one-year terms to assist the Court with legal research and writing; executive assistants and administrative personnel; and personnel devoted to two judicial commissions: the Permanent Judicial Commission on Children, Youth and Families (the "Children's Commission") and the Texas Judicial Commission on Mental Health ("JCMH"). More than 88% of the Court's operating budget is devoted to salaries for these employees.

The Legislature has recognized the Court's role in our government in prior Sessions by giving the Court authority to manage limited resources, including exemptions for certain limitations in the General Appropriations Act and authority to carry over unexpended balances between years in the biennium. The Court requests continued authority to utilize these features.

Accordingly, the Court requests the following exceptional items:

Exceptional Item 1. Judiciary-Wide Inflation Relief and Staff Retention and Recruitment in Strategy A.1.1 Appellate Court Operations (\$315,752 per year), and in Strategy B.1.4 Judicial Commission on Mental Health (\$47,491 per year), and in Strategy B.1.3 Children's Commission (\$65,738 per year) for a combined total of \$428,681 per year

Even after the increased funding received in the 88th Legislative Session, attorneys and staff of the Article IV Courts and Agencies remain impacted by increasing costs due to inflation and the draw of more lucrative employment opportunities in state governmental entities outside the judicial branch, the federal courts, and the private legal sector.

The Supreme Court of Texas is acutely aware of the need to adequately compensate its highly skilled and specialized staff to efficiently and accurately assist in the decision of matters of the highest importance to the jurisprudence of the State of Texas — for citizens, candidates, and the business community alike. In concert with the rest of the judicial branch, the Court is therefore seeking a 6% increase in staff salaries this biennium.

Retention and recruiting of highly skilled candidates are of utmost importance and training of new staff is costly, not only because of the caliber and complexity of the cases the Court and its staff handle, but also because of the added pressures of high ethical and confidentiality standards and risk to personal security and privacy that accompany working in the judicial branch.

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The Supreme Court along with the Article IV Courts and Agencies therefore collectively request a 6% salary increase for all staff to maintain and recruit a strong, experienced, and efficient judicial workforce.

Exceptional Item 2. Three Additional FTEs (\$335,052 per year)

A. Staff Attorney for Mandamus and Emergency Filings (\$138,446 per year under Strategy A.1.1 Appellate Court Operations)

Due to an increasing number of mandamus and emergency filings received in the Supreme Court, the Court requests funding for one additional full-time staff attorney. The Court's internal statistics gathered from January to June of 2024 reflect that approximately 23% of the Court's total filings received were mandamus petitions and 55% of those were emergencies. Many of these emergency matters related to the March 2024 primary election, and the Court anticipates another uptick in emergency filings coming as the November general election nears, but there are numerous matters of public importance that flow through the Court's mandamus and emergency docket, such as: the constitutionality of certain state statutes, apex depositions of high ranking officials, challenges to temporary orders issued by the intermediate appellate courts, supersedeas challenges by businesses and individuals to protect property and assets, certified questions from the federal courts, and family law matters. To give these cases the attention they deserve and to assist the Justices with their prompt and often emergency resolution, the Court requires funding for one additional full-time staff attorney.

B. Staff Attorney for Juvenile Justice Training and Resource Development for the Children's Commission (\$121,800 per year under Strategy B.1.2)

To date the Children's Commission has focused its efforts on strengthening judicial resources and coordinating among stakeholders for children and families in the child welfare system; however, children in the juvenile justice system present with many of the same challenges and needs and there is significant overlap between the two types of proceedings. Involvement in both the child welfare and juvenile justice systems is associated with higher risks for mental health, educational, and vocational challenges as well as higher rates of recidivism, longer stays in detention, placement instability, and poor permanency outcomes. Judges in Texas who hear juvenile justice cases should have easy access to resources to keep them well-informed about law, policy, rules, best practices, and developing research. The courts are a key partner in bringing legal and other community stakeholders together to navigate complex issues and develop pragmatic solutions.

Accordingly, the Court seeks to add one additional full-time employee to the staff of the Children's Commission to specialize in juvenile justice matters. This position, if created, could begin to assist with: judicial training in the juvenile justice system; reference materials such as bench cards and updated legal alerts and practical tips; peer to peer support through correspondence from expert judges; and improved cross-system collaboration between the judiciary and education, child welfare, mental health, medical, and community providers. An exploratory committee of practicing Texas judges has concluded that there is little dedicated support for the judiciary in the area of juvenile justice law. With an increased emphasis on juvenile justice, the Children's Commission could help to improve outcomes for children and families in Texas, regardless of which door they use to enter the courthouse.

This request goes hand in hand with Exceptional Item 6 below, which requests funding for the operating expenses of the program.

C. Program Specialist for Curriculum Creation and Statewide Training Coordination for the Judicial Commission on Mental Health (\$74,806 per year under Strategy B.1.4)

The Supreme Court seeks funding to add one Program Specialist IV position at the Judicial Commission on Mental Health to assist the Commission with educating Texas

judges, attorneys, and mental health stakeholders. The Commission currently operates with only seven FTEs: one Executive Director, three Staff Attorneys, one Communications Manager, one Executive Assistant, one half time Finance Manager, and one half time Accountant. The programmatic side of the Commission's work is handled by four FTEs and one additional employee is needed as the Commission's work grows and matures.

The position would focus on curriculum creation and coordination of the Commission's major statewide training programs to include the annual Judicial Summit on Mental Health, the Court Liaison Pilot Program, the County Mental Health Law Plan, and the Mental Health Courts Collaborative.

Exceptional Item 3. Increased Non-Personnel Operating Costs for the Supreme Court and the Judicial Commission on Mental Health (\$58,000 per year under Strategy A.1.1, and \$52,000 per year under Strategy B.1.4)

The Supreme Court seeks increased funding to meet the higher costs of the following essential operating costs: Westlaw legal research subscription, legal periodical services, consumable supplies, replacement of aging desk chairs and computer monitors, equipment maintenance contracts including our secure metal detector for public entry into the courtroom, mandatory bar dues increases for attorneys, registration fees for educational conferences, and legal organization membership dues for Justices and attorneys.

The Judicial Commission on Mental Health similarly requests funding to maintain current operating levels due to pricing increases on goods, services, and travel that are core to its mission. Operating costs have increased and are expected to continue increasing in the following areas: meeting space/venue rental, audio visual aids, printing, travel to conduct training programs, and equipment rentals. This additional funding is needed to continue operations at current levels in the next biennium.

Exceptional Item 4. Target Salary Increases for Five Deputy Clerk IV's (\$32,500 per year under Strategy A.1.1 Appellate Court Operations)

Upon review of recently published public salary information, the Court has determined that our Deputy Clerk IV employees are earning less on average than their peers in other Texas appellate courts, including in areas where the cost of living is less than in Austin. To remedy this imbalance within the same position category and job duties, the Court is requesting \$32,500 per year to increase the salaries of our five Deputy Clerk IV employees by \$6,500 each. This is in addition to any inflation relief that might be granted under Exceptional Item 1. These employees assist the Court with processing filings, including sensitive and sealed matters, interact with the public directly on behalf of the Court, and the position requires training and technical skill in utilizing both the e-filing system and the Court's electronic case management system. This is one of our lowest paying positions, and the Court has observed particularly high turnover in this position.

Exceptional Item 5. Travel Funding for Oral Arguments (\$35,000 per year under Strategy A.1.1 Appellate Court Operations)

The Supreme Court has traditionally heard out-of-town oral arguments twice per term in offsite locations throughout the State of Texas, but the ability of the Court to do so within current travel funding levels has decreased in recent years. These visits typically include oral arguments of active matters before the Court that term, usually of cases that have a connection to the specific city or region visited, as well as educational visits and Q&A sessions with students, professors, local attorneys, and the public. As statewide officials, it is important for Texans outside of Austin to observe the Court in action, and the visits serve an important civic education purpose and increase public trust and confidence in the judiciary. Section 22.3015 of the Texas Government Code provides that a justice of the Supreme Court engaged in the discharge of official duties in a county other than the justice's county of residence is entitled to traveling and other necessary expenses, and these trips would qualify, but without specific funding for this purpose, the Court will not be able to continue traveling or will at least be quite geographically-limited in its choices. For security, the Justices travel with security officers and a limited number of staff members, and this exceptional item is intended to cover transportation, lodging, and per diem costs for the

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Justices, security officers, and limited staff.

Exceptional Item 6. Juvenile Justice Program Operations (\$53,000 per year under Strategy B.1.3 Children's Commission)

To provide the services described under Exceptional Item 2(B) above, the Children's Commission seeks \$53,000 annually for program operating costs including consumable supplies, travel, and venue rental fees to conduct judicial and stakeholder training, grants, and other operating expenses.

Exceptional Item 7. Pilot Program Expansion of the Local Court Liaison Program to Five Additional Counties (\$1,453,500 in FY2026 only under Strategy B.1.4)

The Texas Judicial Commission on Mental Health (JCMH) was established by joint order of the Supreme Court of Texas and the Texas Court of Criminal Appeals to develop, implement, and coordinate policy initiatives designed to improve the courts' interaction with—and the administration of justice for—children, adults, and families with mental health needs or intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD).

JCMH created a small pilot program in 2021 that provides counties with a local court liaison to connect the courts and the parties with the local mental health authority and other services to facilitate mental health care when that issue arises. The pilot program provides judges with the knowledge, tools, and resources to ensure that courts are not contributing to delays in placement in the state hospital system and are making the best use of inpatient competency restoration services, thereby stalling the growth of the forensic waitlist. Each pilot county received 100% funding for the first two years with step down funding at 80%-60% in year 3 and 4, respectively, for a total not to exceed \$290,700 per program.

JCMH requests \$1,453,500 in FY2026 to create five additional pilot sites in five additional counties that would follow the Pilot Program Implementation Guide created by the National Center for State Courts. This would allow JCMH to continue developing innovative pathways and quicker interventions that honor public safety and treatment compliance while working to prevent decompensation of individuals awaiting restoration or other intervention.

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### OTHER JUDICIAL BRANCH BUDGET MATTERS

In addition to the exceptional items listed above, the Supreme Court supports the following items that are included in other agencies' budget requests:

### JUDICIAL SALARY INCREASES — COMPTROLLER JUDICIARY SECTION

The Supreme Court supports the Judicial Compensation Commission's recommendation for the 2026-2027 biennium. It includes a one-time 30% salary increase to the base salary of a district judge. Qualified, careful, committed, and trustworthy Texas judges can only be recruited and retained if their salaries are adjusted and increased appropriately over time, and judicial salaries in Texas are disproportionately low in comparison to our peer states. It has been over a decade since the base salary of a district judge has been raised, which last occurred in 2013.

### OFFICE OF COURT ADMINISTRATION

For the Supreme Court and the Third Branch to function efficiently, securely, and accurately, it is vital that the Office of Court Administration (OCA) be adequately funded. The Supreme Court and the judicial branch utilize many technological, data, interpreting, security, and other administrative services consolidated through the OCA.

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The Supreme Court fully supports OCA's exceptional item requests, and, in addition to the judiciary-wide inflation relief and staff retention and recruitment item, draws special attention to the following requests: "Replace Judicial Branch Legacy System – Texas Appellate Case Management System; Improve Data Reporting Accuracy; and Business Court Operational Expenses."


### NATIONAL CENTER FOR STATE COURTS — COMPTROLLER JUDICIARY SECTION

Judiciary-Wide Inflation Relief and Staff Retention and Recruitment in Strategy A.1.1 Appellate Court Operations (\$315,752 per year), and in Strategy B.1.4 Judicial Commission on Mental Health (\$47,491 per year), and in Strategy B.1.3 Children's Commission (\$65,738 per year) for a combined total of \$428,681 per year. #### **DESCRIPTION / JUSTIFICATION:**

Due to an increasing number of mandamus and emergency filings received in the Supreme Court, the Court requests funding for one additional full-time staff attorney. The Court's internal statistics gathered from January to June of 2024 reflect that approximately 23% of the Court's total filings received were mandamus petitions and 55% of those were emergencies. Many of these emergency matters related to the March 2024 primary election, and the Court anticipates another uptick in emergency filings coming as the November general election nears, but there are numerous matters of public importance that flow through the Court's mandamus and emergency docket, such as: the constitutionality of certain state statutes, apex depositions of high ranking officials, challenges to temporary orders issued by the intermediate appellate courts, supersedeas challenges by businesses and individuals to protect property and assets, certified questions from the federal courts, and family law matters.

#### **EXTERNAL/INTERNAL FACTORS:**

Accordingly, the Court seeks to add one additional full-time employee to the staff of the Children's Commission to specialize in juvenile justice matters. This position, if created, could begin to assist with: judicial training in the juvenile justice system; reference materials such as bench cards and updated legal alerts and practical tips; peer to peer support through correspondence from expert judges; and improved cross-system collaboration between the judiciary and education, child welfare, mental health, medical, and community providers.

The Supreme Court seeks funding to add one Program Specialist IV position at the Judicial Commission on Mental Health to assist the Commission with educating Texas judges, attorneys, and mental health stakeholders. The position would focus on curriculum creation and coordination of the Commission's major statewide training programs to include the annual Judicial Summit on Mental Health, the Court Liaison Pilot Program, the County Mental Health Law Plan, and the Mental Health Courts Collaborative.

As statewide officials, it is important for Texans outside of Austin to observe the Court in action, and the visits serve an important civic education purpose and increase public trust and confidence in the judiciary. Section 22.3015 of the Texas Government Code provides that a justice of the Supreme Court engaged in the discharge of official duties in a county other than the justice's county of residence is entitled to traveling and other necessary expenses, and these trips would qualify, but without specific funding for this purpose, the Court will not be able to continue traveling or will at least be quite geographically-limited in its choices. For security, the Justices travel with security officers and a limited number of staff members, and this exceptional item is intended to cover transportation, lodging, and per diem costs for the Justices, security officers, and limited staff. The Texas Judicial Commission on Mental Health (JCMH) was established by joint order of the Supreme Court of Texas and the Texas Court of Criminal Appeals to develop, implement, and coordinate policy initiatives designed to improve the courts' interaction with—and the administration of justice for—children, adults, and families with mental health needs or intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD).

JCMH created a small pilot program in 2021 that provides counties with a local court liaison to connect the courts and the parties with the local mental health authority and other services to facilitate mental health care when that issue arises. The pilot program provides judges with the knowledge, tools, and resources to ensure that courts are not contributing to delays in placement in the state hospital system and are making the best use of inpatient competency restoration services, thereby stalling the growth of the forensic waitlist. Each pilot county received 100% funding for the first two years with step down funding at 80%-60% in year 3 and 4, respectively, for a total not to exceed \$290,700 per program.

#### **EXTERNAL/INTERNAL FACTORS:**

JCMH requests \$1,453,500 in FY2026 to create five additional pilot sites in five additional counties that would follow the Pilot Program Implementation Guide created by the National Center for State Courts. This would allow JCMH to continue developing innovative pathways and quicker interventions that honor public safety and treatment compliance while working to prevent decompensation of individuals awaiting restoration or other intervention.
