In the Matter of Alfonso Kennard, Jr.

- 1. The Court has received Alfonso Kennard, Jr.'s motion for resignation in lieu of discipline, the Chief Disciplinary Counsel's response, and Kennard's waiver of the ten-day period for withdrawing his motion.
- 2. The Court finds that the requirements of Part X, Texas Rules of Disciplinary Procedure, are met; that the allegations of Professional Misconduct in the response are conclusively established; and that Kennard's timely resignation is effective to prevent the Board of Disciplinary Appeals' August 14, 2025 judgment of suspension in Cause No. 71282 from taking effect.
- 3. It is therefore ordered that the law license of Alfonso Kennard Jr., State Bar No. 24036888, is canceled.
- 4. Effective immediately, Kennard is prohibited from practicing law in this State.
- 5. Kennard must:
 - immediately surrender his State Bar card and law license to the Clerk of this Court or file an affidavit stating why he cannot;
 - immediately notify each of his current clients and opposing counsel of his resignation in writing;
 - immediately return to current and former clients all property, including papers and files, and unearned compensation in his possession;
 - immediately notify each court in which he has any matter pending of the terms of this order; the style and case number of pending matters; and the names, addresses, and phone numbers of his clients in those cases; and
 - within thirty days of the date of this order, file with the Statewide Compliance Monitor, State Bar of Texas, P.O. Box 12487, Austin, TX 78711, an affidavit stating that he has complied with each requirement in this paragraph.
- 6. Conditions precedent for Kennard's reinstatement include these payments of restitution:
 - \$3,500 to Renetta A. Moss;
 - \$8,804.92 to Kristina Blanco;
 - \$14,000 to Crystal Flack;
 - \$5,000 to Marsa Robinson;
 - \$15,500 to Bongsong Kim; and
 - \$5,000 to Dash Speer.

- 7. Conditions precedent for Kennard's reinstatement also include the payment of \$5,000 in attorney's fees to the State Bar.
- 8. All payments must be made by certified or cashier's check or by money order. Payments must be mailed to the State Bar of Texas, Office of Chief Disciplinary Counsel, P.O. Box 12487, Austin, TX 78711 or delivered to 1414 Colorado Street, Austin, Texas 78701.
