RULES OF THE JUDICIAL BRANCH CERTIFICATION COMMISSION

10.0 Guardianship Registration

10.35 Specialized Training – Alzheimer's Disease, Dementia, or Related Disorders

- (a) Required Training. Except as provided in (b), a guardian of the person or of the estate of a ward must annually receive training provided on the Commission's website regarding Alzheimer's disease, dementia, and related disorders, if the ward is:
 - (1) 60 years of age or older; or
 - (2) is diagnosed as having Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or a related disorder.
- (b) Exceptions. A guardian is not required to complete the training under this Rule if
 - (1) the guardian is certified by the Commission, an attorney, or a corporate fiduciary;
 - (2) the guardian is appointed as a temporary guardian under Estates Code Chapter 1251; or
 - (3) the court waives the training requirement in accordance with Rule 10.4.
- (c) Initial Training; Timing. A guardian must complete the initial training within 6 months after the date of the guardian's appointment. If a temporary guardian's term is extended, then the guardian must complete the initial training within 6 months after the extension. If the ward of a guardian turns 60 during the guardianship, the guardian must complete the training within 6 months after the ward's 60th birthday.
- (d) *Renewal*. Each guardian who is subject to the training requirement must repeat the training at least once per year until the termination of the guardianship.
- (e) Commission Duties. On request, the Commission must provide the web address for the training materials or written training materials and instruction for completing the training requirement.

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- (f) *Content.* The training must include information regarding:
 - (1) common aspects of aging;
 - (2) warning signs of dementia and Alzheimer's disease;
 - (3) effective strategies for communicating with a person who is diagnosed with dementia or Alzheimer's disease;
 - (4) effective strategies and resources available for supporting a person who is diagnosed with dementia or Alzheimer's disease in exercising their rights; and
 - (5) any other subjects or matters that would be beneficial for a guardian to know in tending to the health, safety, well-being and interests of a person who is diagnosed with dementia or Alzheimer's disease.
- (g) *Probate Court Duties*. A probate court must ensure guardians who are subject to this Rule timely complete the training.

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
