



2. During the previous seven years, Plaintiff Anita Hutchings commenced, prosecuted, or maintained more than eight litigations as a pro se litigant other than in a small claims court.
3. Seven of the eight litigations were decided adversely against Plaintiff Anita Hutchings and the remaining litigation has been permitted to remain pending at least two years without the matter having been brought to trial or hearing.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Defendants Shuo Chen and Hank Neuer, LLC's *Motion to Determine Vexatious Litigant and Request for Security* is **GRANTED**.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Plaintiff Anita Hutchings is determined by the Court to be a vexatious litigant.


IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Plaintiff Anita Hutchings is required to post bond in the amount of \$7,500. with the District Clerk as security per Section 11.055 of the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code within thirty (30) days of this Order. If such security is not posted, this case will be dismissed with prejudice pursuant to Section 11.056 of the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Plaintiff Anita Hutchings is hereby prohibited from filing any new lawsuits as a pro se litigant in any court in the State of Texas until Plaintiff receives permission from the appropriate local administrative judge pursuant to Sections 11.101 and 11.102 of the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code. Failure to comply with this ORDER shall be punishable by contempt, jail time, and all other lawful means of enforcement under Section 11.101(b) of the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Clerk of the Court provide a copy of this order to the Office of Court administration of the Texas Judicial System within 30 days of entering this order.

All other relief requested in Defendants' Motion and not granted herein is denied.
