
Disbursement of Voluntary Access to Justice Contributions


ORDERED that:


1. On April 8, 2026, the Texas Access to Justice Commission reported that Texas lawyers donated \$1,742,853.64 to support basic civil legal services for the poor during the 2025 Access to Justice Contribution Campaign.
2. The Court has consulted with the Commission, the State Bar of Texas, the Texas Access to Justice Foundation, and the Texas Bar Foundation about how the money should be distributed. After doing so, the Court has determined that \$250,000 should be distributed to the Texas Bar Foundation, with the balance going to the Texas Access to Justice Foundation.
3. Each foundation must apply its share to programs that meet the requirements of Government Code sections 51.941(e) and 51.943 for basic civil legal services to the indigent. With this caveat, the Court orders that the State Bar of Texas and the Clerk of the Court transfer from the State Bar's Access to Justice Account:
 - a. \$250,000 to the Texas Bar Foundation; and
 - b. the balance to the Texas Access to Justice Foundation.


