ORDER DEEMING PLAINTIFF A VEXATIOUS LITIGANT

On August 12, 2026, the Court heard Defendants Ranelle Meroney, Taylor Yetter, Kim Chambers, and Anna Ortiz's Motion to Deem Plaintiff a Vexatious Litigant in the above-styled and numbered cause.

In making this order, the Court considered the Defendants' Motion, evidence presented at the hearing and arguments of the Parties.

The Court finds that in the three year-period immediately preceding the date Defendants Meroney, Yetter, Chambers, and Ortiz filed this motion under Section 11.051 of the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code, Plaintiff Caroline Sue Barnett had commenced, prosecuted, or maintained at least five litigations as a pro se litigant other than in small claims court that have been finally determined adversely to Caroline Sue Barnett as required by Section 11.054(1) of the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code.

The Court finds that Defendants Meroney, Yetter, Chambers, and Ortiz's Motion to Deem Plaintiff Caroline Sue Barnett a Vexatious Litigant pursuant to Section 11.051 *et seq.* of the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code be, and is hereby, **GRANTED**.

Therefore, it is **ORDERED** that Caroline Sue Barnett is a vexatious litigant as that term is defined by Section 11.054 of the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Plaintiff Caroline Sue Barnett, having been found to be a vexatious litigant, is prohibited from filing, on her own behalf as a pro se litigant, any new litigation in any state district or statutory county court in Texas, against any party, as provided by Section 11.102 of the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code as follows:

PERMISSION BY LOCAL ADMINISTRATIVE JUDGE. (a) A vexatious litigant subject to a profiling order under Section 11.101 is prohibited from filing, pro se, new litigation in a court to which the order applies without seeking the permission of:

- (1) the local administrative judge of the type of court in which the vexatious litigant intends to file, except as provided by Subdivision (2); or
- (2) the local administrative district judge of the county in which the vexatious litigant intends to file if the litigant intends to file in a justice or constitutional county court.

A vexatious litigant subject to a pre-filing order under Section 11.101 who files a request seeking permission to file litigation shall provide a copy of the request to all defendants named in the proposed litigation.

Disobeying this order is subject to contempt of court.
